DESTINY AND THE WILL OF GOD

Ephesians 1:9 (KJV 1900)

⁹ Having made known unto us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure which he hath purposed in himself:

According to this scripture, few statements can be made:

- The will of God was a mystery; meaning something that is difficult or impossible to understand or explain.
- The mystery of the will of God has been revealed to us.
- The will of God is a pleasure to himself

WHAT DO WE KNOW OF THE REVEALED MYSTERY?

Let us answer this question in three points:

1. We are the chosen of God

Ephesians 1:4 (KJV)

⁴ According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world

- WE ARE PREDESTINATED UNTO THE ADOPTION OF CHILDREN BY JESUS CHRIST Ephesians 1:5 (KJV 1900)

⁵ Having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will,

- The predestination is associated with sanctification and ordination Jeremiah 1:4-5 (KJV)

⁴ Then the word of the LORD came unto me, saying, ⁵ Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and **before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee**, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations.

- The predestination is by election according to God's purpose Romans $9:11-13\ (KJV)$

¹¹ (For the children being not yet born, neither having done any good or evil, that **the purpose of God** according to election might stand, not of works, but of him that calleth;) ¹² It was said unto her, The elder shall serve the younger. ¹³ As it is written, Jacob have I loved, but Esau have I hated.

Romans 9:15-16 (KJV)

¹⁵ For he saith to Moses, I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion. ¹⁶ So then it is not of him that willeth, nor of him that runneth, but of God that sheweth mercy.

2. We are chosen to be holy and blameless

Ephesians 1:4 (KJV)

⁴ that we should be holy and without blame before him in love:

- OUR CONDITION BEFORE CHRIST SAVED US

Ephesians 2:1-2 (KJV)

¹ And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; ² Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience:

- PRAISE THE GLORY OF HIS GRACE

Ephesians 1:6-7 (KJV)

⁶ To the praise of **the glory of his grace**, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved.

⁷ In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace;

We cannot really praise the glory of God's grace until we understand what he has done for us.

- We are chosen to be holy for what God has done for us through Christ Ephesians 2:8 (KJV)

⁷ That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in his kindness toward us through Christ Jesus. ⁸ For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:

Ephesians 2:4-6 (KJV)

⁴ But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, ⁵ Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) ⁶ And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:

The grace of God flows out of his mercies

3. We are blessed with spiritual blessings in Christ

Ephesians 1:3 (KJV)

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ:

This is a signed blank check

- Our spiritual blessings must be pulled down through prayer John $14:14\ (KJV)$

¹⁴ If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it.

- SIN LIMITS WHAT GOD CAN DO FOR YOU

Psalm 66:18 (KJV)

¹⁸ If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me:

- ACT OF DISOBEDIENCE LIMITS WHAT GOD CAN DO FOR YOU John $15:16\ (KJV)$

¹⁶ Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.
